D. Road Report May 2022

Replaced a cross drain on upper Davidson St. Replaced a cross drain on Perry St. Rebuilt a stone catch basin on lower Glendale Rd. Graded ditches on Fleetwood Rd. Patched potholes on Townwood Rd. Cut trees back on Frisco Hill, North Broadway Ave., and North Brentwood Ave. Fixed a washed cross drain on 12th St. Extension. Mowed roadsides in the Township. Cleaned up the back lot for cleanup day, held clean up day. Cleaned drains around the Township. Redid the tail spreader to fit the 2019 International. Cut some of the rear bumper off the 2005 Freightliner so it would fit into the paver. Used 500 gallons of diesel fuel and 55.8 gallons of gasoline. E. Engineer Report

The monthly Engineer's Report was presented by Emily Palmer and is attached with the meeting packet. The Bologne Valley Bridge and Leech Ln surveys were performed. The 2022 Road Program bids were opened. There was only 1 bidder, Youngblood paving in the amount of \$222,237.25 which is lower than expected. That is for the tar and chip as well as paving James Dr. James Drive paving came in higher than expected but an overall lower bid was placed, LSSE estimated \$236,000.00. Emmett Santillo made the motion to accept the 2022 Road bid in the amount of \$222,237.25. Emmett Santillo made the motion to accept the Zeigler Plan of Subdivision contingent on addressing the Engineering comments and executing the Sewage Facilities Planning Module. Tom Roush seconded. All in favor. Emmett Santillo made the motion to execute the Fray Planning Module Mailer. John Axtell seconded. All in favor. Emmett Santillo made the motion to accept the Caldwell and Douglass Extension letters regarding the subdivisions. Tom Roush seconded. All in favor.

F. Ryan Long-Solicitor Report

Solicitor, Ryan Long spoke about the logging ordinance and Per Capita Ordinance. Emmett Santillo made the motion to advertise the regarding the Logging and Per Capita Ordinances with intent to adopt both in July 2022. John Axtell seconded. All in favor.

ACTION ON BILLS:

Emmett Santillo made the motion to accept the bills as presented in the amount of \$191,734.47. Tom Roush seconded. All in Favor.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

A. Motion by Emmett Santillo to approve financing the 2022 Police Explorer in the amount of \$45,609.00 which includes the \$750.00 WesBanco charge for a 5-year lease with \$1.00 buyout. John Axtell seconded. All in favor.

NEW BUSINESS:

- A. Motion by Emmett Santillo to approve the quote for TextMyGov in the amount of \$3,000 annually and a one time set up fee of \$500.00 with the cost to be split 3-ways with the Sewer and the Water Authority. John Axtell seconded. All in favor.
- B. Motion by Emmett Santillo to approve the quote from Polite Electric in the amount of \$3600.00 plus \$435.00 for a circuit in the Township building as well. John Axtell seconded. All in favor.
- C. Motion by Emmett Santillo to approve selling the 1988 Massey Ferguson to the second highest bidder from MuniciBid in the amount of \$7,409.00. Tom Roush seconded. All in favor.
- D. Motion by Emmett Santillo to provide 1/3 of the cost, which is \$10,355.38, to the Fire Department for the County-wide digital radio upgrade. John Axtell seconded. All in favor.

E. Motion by Emmett Santillo to approve the Beaver County COG 2022 Summer/Winter Commodities Contacts #1, Contract #2, Contract #7 and Contract #8. Tom Roush seconded. All in favor.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Paul MacMurdo – 155 Country Club Dr – Provided an overview of the flooding of his property and wanted to know if the Engineers have had time to review what he provided. Mr. MacMurdo stated that a drain cap would go a long way. Emmett Santillo read a statement prepared from Solicitor, Ryan Long, in regard to Mr. MacMurdo's situation. "The Township has not accepted responsibility for the reported flooding or draining issues on Country Club Dr despite you making representations and statements to the contrary. This has been the Township position from the very first time you filed a complaint. It has also been our position when you sued us, it was also our position when the Township won in court, and it will continue to be our position moving forward." Mr. MacMurdo explained why he sued the Township and explained that this is in addition to the law suit he filed for not adhering to floodplain issues.

ADJOURNMENT:

At 8:04 pm Emmett Santillo made a motion to adjourn. Tom Roush seconded the motion. All in favor. **Mr. MacMurdo continued to try to address the Supervisors after the meeting had been adjourned and Chief Becze had to inform him that the meeting was over, it was time to go.**
